We will be practicing our first set of safety drills of the 23/24 school year over the next two weeks including a fire drill, hold & secure, and lockdown. These drills prepare

students in case emergencies should arise while at school and ensure our school is safe for teaching and learning. Any questions, please reach out to your child's teacher.





It is very important for your child's well-being and achievement to come to school on time, play with friends on the playground, and start class together with his/her/their teachers and classmates. If your child will be absent due to illness, appointments or family commitments, please report the absence in advance by using our **Safe Arrival System**:

<u>https://www.hrce.ca/SafeArrival</u> It is vital that students are also picked up promptly at dismissal time on the playground, as their teachers will be in meetings and working to prepare for the following day. Here is our school schedule:

8:10am: Playground supervision begins.

8:20am: Classroom instruction begins.

10:20-10:35: Recess (Snack & Outdoor Play)

11:50-12:30: First Lunch (Eating & Outdoor Play) 12:35-1:15: Second Lunch

2:15: Dismissal

RECESS & LUNCH AT FAIRVIEW HEIGHTS:

- Students should bring a refillable water bottle each day. We have filling stations throughout the school.
- We do not use microwaves. Students need lunches that do not require heating. Using a thermos is a great way to send a hot lunch.
- Lunch monitors supervise students during lunch. The lunch break is shared between eating in classrooms and playing outside.
- If your child requires utensils to eat the lunch they are bringing, you need to send utensils. We do not have utensils to give out to students.
- Recess should be a quick snack!
- Any child that would like a snack throughout the day will have access to healthy snacks such as apples, clementines, yogurt, cereal, granola bars and cheese.

















A school-wide notice will be sent home to all parents/guardians when school staff suspect a case of head lice. What Are Head Lice?

Head lice are a common condition that can affect anyone. If your child has head lice, they can come back to school once treated. Public Health recommends two treatments.

Please note, the following guidelines are helpful in preventing the spread of head lice:

- Notify your principal and your child(ren)'s classroom teacher if your child(ren) has or have head lice and keep the school informed about head lice issues as they arise.
- Check your child(ren)'s head(s) and hair regularly, including: once a week as part of your routine, after every sleepover, any time they have had contact with someone with lice.
- Keep long hair tied back or braided.
- Teach your child(ren) not to share personal items that have touched their head, such as brushes, combs, barrettes, headbands, hair elastics, towels, hats, helmet, toques, scarves, pencils or crayons.
- Teach your child(ren) to put their hats and scarves in their coat sleeves or backpacks when they take them off.

Principals may assist families in accessing the specific supports that they require, such as means of obtaining head lice treatments. The confidentiality, privacy, dignity, and best interests of students and their families will be respected at all times.
